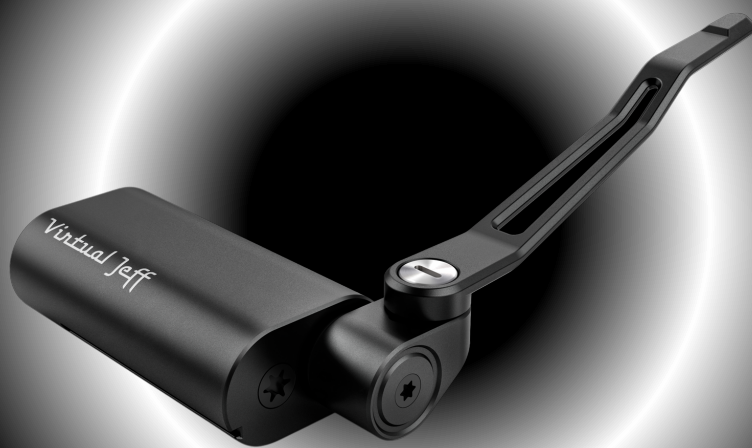

**REMOVE MOUNT**

## REMOVE MOUNT

The mount is quite easy to remove but use patience so you don't damage the guitar surface

## TOOLS

- screwdriver
- old 'E' or 'B' string
- Naptha or similar

## HOW TO

The adhesive tape has rubber-based adhesive on a thin foam substrate. It's the foam that makes removal straightforward.

Take an old 'E' or 'B' string and wrap both ends around a screwdriver to form a 'noose'. This can now be used like a cheese-cutter to slice through the foam.

Position the noose at the bottom of the mount and pull it through the foam in a see-saw action. Be careful not to bang the screwdriver into the body!

The mount is now off the surface, leaving bits of foam and adhesive residue. Apply naptha or similar to the residue and leave for 5-10 minutes. Now apply a little more and work it in with your finger.

Use your thumbnail to carefully scrape off the residue and clean the last remnants with a little more naptha and a clean soft cloth.

Do a quick polish and you're done. You can clean the residue off the mount and re-use it.

NOTE: The companion video shows this process better than text!

### IMPORTANT:

**The rubber-based adhesive won't damage any common guitar finish (poly, nitro, acrylic etc) but impatience when you're removing the residue might. Naptha is generally safe on most finishes but consult your luthier or guitar manufacturer if in doubt. Take it slow and careful and no one will ever know you had a mount attached!**
